DESCRIPTION OF OCCULT LIST:

(1) Anime, also sometimes called japanime or japanimation, refers to an animated series or film from Japan, often adapted from manga).

(2) Automatic writing is a mode of writing in which neither consciousness nor willpower intervenes. This process has at least five different fields of application: literature, psychology, painting, parapsychology or self-hypnosis)

(3) Biofeedback is a technique used in medicine, physiotherapy, psychology, etc., to teach individuals to modify their physiological activity in order to improve their health and performance.

(4) A chain letter is a letter asking the recipient to send a copy to each of his or her relatives, or else something "bad" will happen to him or her. Sometimes even a gift or sum of money is promised.

(5) Channeling is an American term from New Age literature that designates a process of communication between a human being and an entity belonging to another dimension.

(6) Charlie Charlie Challenge is a divination game in which the putative answer to a yes-no question is found by waiting for a balanced pencil to point to the word "Yes" or "No" written on a sheet of paper.

(7) A curandero is a healer in Hispanic America. They administer remedies for illnesses. Their powers are considered supernatural, insofar as popular belief has it that they deal directly with malevolent spirits at the root of disease.

(8) In some native North American cultures, a dreamcatcher is a handcrafted object of Ojibwe origin (called asubakatchin or bawajige nagwaagan in this language) consisting of a hoop, usually made of willow, and a net-like network of threads. The decorations are different for each dream catcher. According to popular belief, the dream catcher prevents bad dreams from invading its owner's sleep. Acting as a filter, it captures the dreams sent by the spirits, preserves the beautiful images of the night and burns the bad visions at first light.

(9) Dream interpretation, also known as onirocriticism or onirocriticism, is the set of ritual or symbolic practices or techniques that attempt, within a given culture, to give meaning to dreams.

(10) A drum circle is an informal gathering of percussionists and dancers who come together in public to drum and dance. It's often seen in parks and on beaches. Drummers usually gather in a circle, with dancers often in the center.

(11) Dungeons & Dragons, often abbreviated to D&D, DnD or AD&D, is the very first tabletop role-playing game in the medieval-fantasy genre. The game was created in 1974 by Americans Gary Gygax and Dave Arneson.

(14) The Enneagram is an ancient, powerful and practical personality study system. It enables us to better understand ourselves and others. The Enneagram is universal and accessible to all. It can be used regardless of an individual's culture, nationality or origin.

(16) The Yi Jing is one of the Chinese classics, whose title can be translated as "Book of Mutations", "Classic of Changes", "Canon of Mutations" or "Book of Transformations". It was originally a treatise on divination, called Zhou Yi.

(17) Iridology is a pseudo-medicine, i.e. not based on evidence and with no proven efficacy. Iridologists claim that each sector of the iris corresponds to an organ.

(18) John Edward McGee Jr, better known as John Edward, is an American author and television host who claims to be a medium.

(19) Kabbalah is an esoteric tradition of Judaism, traditionally presented as the "secret oral law" given by YHWH to Moses on Mount Sinai, along with the "public written law". It has its roots in the mystical currents of ancient synagogal Judaism.

(20) Hopi katsina figurines (Hopi language: tithu or katsintithu), also known as kachina dolls, are figurines carved, usually from poplar root, by the Hopi to instruct young girls

and newlyweds about katsinas or katsinam, the immortal beings who bring rain, control other aspects of the natural world and society, and act as messengers between humans and the spirit world.

(21) Kokopelli is a French association that distributes royalty-free, reproducible seeds from organic and biodynamic agriculture, with the aim of preserving seed and vegetable biodiversity.

(27) The medicine wheel is a sacred circle created by native peoples using stones. Its iconographic representation has become a symbol of native culture, which has been assimilated into New Age mysticism.

(28) Obeah (sometimes spelled Obi, Obeya or Obia) is a syncretic set of occult spiritual, medical and judicial practices that originated in West African slave societies in the West Indies.

(29) Ouija (pronounced: /wi.ʒa/ in French; in English: /ˈwiː.dʒə/ or /ˈwiː.dʒi/) is a board supposed to enable communication with "spirits".

(30) Qi gong, qigong, chi gong or chi kung is a traditional Chinese gymnastic and breathing practice based on the knowledge and control of the breath, combining slow movements, breathing exercises and concentration.

(31) Reiki is an energy art of Japanese origin developed by Mikao Usui in the late 19th century. "Rei" means "universal", "all": matter, soul and spirit. And ki (or Qi) refers to the vital energy that circulates within each individual, as in Chinese medicine.

(32) At the beginning of the XVII^e century, the manifestos of the Rosicrucian brotherhood appeared in Germany. In them, the Rosicrucians are presented as a secret order allegedly founded in the XV^e century by a mythical figure, Christian Rosenkreutz

(33) Runes are a set of stones, pieces of wood or objects on which sacred symbols are inscribed. These runic symbols, known as staves, represent the letters of an ancient Germanic alphabet, used for writing, divination and magic long ago.

(34) Nuestra Señora de la Santa Muerte, or Santísima Muerte, is a character from Latin American folklore. She personifies death, in a similar way to the Grim Reaper in European folklore. Unlike her, however, she is associated with positive attributes such as healing and protection.

(35) Santería, also known as Regla de Ocha, Regla de Ifá, Regla de Osha-Ifá, Regla lucumí or lucumi, is a religion native to Cuba derived from the Yoruba religion.
